Matthew 5:13

INFRODUCTION: The words of this text are the text of the most famous sermon ever preached, the Sermon of the Mount. Seated on the side of the mountain of Galilee, Jesus addressed this sermon kx primarily to his 12 disciples and the others who were present. The contents of the sermon have been considered in the past several messages but we come to the fresh section. We come from the descriptions of the Chrsitian character which has been given in verse 1-12 to an applied description as He comes to tell us what a Christian is. This brings us to consider how the Christian should manifest his life. We realize what we are, what we must be. You must remember that this was not just an evangelistic sermon, it was not to present the plan of salvation but it describes some of the characteristics of those who are saved and lets them know what kind of behaviour is expected of them with respect to God and fellow human beings. You see, it is futile for us to expect the unsaved to apply the principles of the sermon of the mount to their ungegenerated lives. The moral, spiritual, and ethical standards proclaimed by Jesus in the sermon on the mount are quite beyond the reach and grasp of the unbelieving world. You might take for example the golden rule. All things therefore whatsoever talls it in a propose "Is as ". and you need to you would take men should do unto you, even so do you also

that ye should show forth the praises of Him who hath called you out of darkness into His marky marvelous light. xxxx Now the same is true here. We are poor of spirit, merciful. and we are to be salt. And when we consider the functions and the purposes of the Christian in this world then we come to discover the mind and purpose of God. We are told very x clearly the relationship of the Christian to the world in general. This question of the function of the Christian is one of the most urgent matters confronting this church and the individual Christian at this present time. This is a diffictalt one to deal with and yet it is very clear in the scriptures as we saw in our considerations back in verse 10 and ID. It may well be that these urgent problems may be for some of us. It is like many that we might suffer persecution as the sin in the world becomes aggravated. The persecutions of the church is like to be increased. Many Christians today are already experiencing this and we ned to pray for our brethern who are suffering such. But the really most urgent question arises even here and now for us in this country. What relationship do Christians have to the world and to society. What does our text say about the Christian in the world. We have a description here or an implication as to what Jesus says. What then is the Biblical attitude toward the world? Well, it is a tragic century

unto them, we often hear it said if anybody follows that rule it follows that he would be in the kingdom of heaven.

But that is an idle remark for it is only subjects of the kingdome of Christ who are capable of observing such a rule.

As we look at these beatitudes we see a revalutionary idea. They were heavenly rather earthly in their estimates as to what constitutes blessedness. The unregenerated world has known never held to such estimates as Jesus talked about here bringing blessedness.

capitalize the pronoun that He is emphasizing and if we would give the propers emphasis to it that our Saviour put to it, we would say "Ye, Ye, Ye are the light of the world". And you would capitalize all three. By saying not only light but salt. So the emphasis is on "ye".

When Jesus said this these Galilean fishermen we know understood what He was talking about. They understood the figure of this description. They knew what salt did. They knew how important it was when they were fishing on the seas of Galilee down there to have what - salt. You are salt. You are the salt of the land, of the warth, Jesus said.

II. The world

The Christian is not someone who isto live in isolation. He is in the world and he is not of it. Her bears a relationship to it. There are 2 things that a Christian is told that he must be. Not of the world in his mind, in is outlook, and yet it means that he must not retire out of the world. This is the whole whole error of the monastery in which the living of the Christian was meant to necessitate the separation of one from society and living a life of comteplation. This is denied everywhere in the scriptures. No where more completely than in this verse for our Lord draws out this truth as we read in Peter, the first epistle, chapter 2, ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nations a peculair people

meat into which it is rubbed. He is as different as the salt is for the wound into which it is put. This external difference still needs to be emphasized and stressed.

He is to glory in this difference. He is to be as a different from other people as the Lord Jesus Christ was clearly different from the world. Separated, unique, understanding, and kind, and this is one of the great functions of the Christian.

III. What is the function of salt?

of salt is to preserve.

his business to preserve as an antiseptic. Take for example as piece of meat. There are certain germs on its surface. REEKER Perhaps in its very substance that was derived from the animal. The business of salt when it is rubbed into the meat, it preserves it against those agencies which tend to disintegrate. Salt's main function therefor e is surely negative rather than positive. It is not only the function of the Christian in the world because as we shall see Later that he is to be the light of the world but this is the first instance a d the first effect as the Christian and that is to preserve. It is still true out in the country when you kill hogs it saves your meat. It preserves your meat. and it is very tragic because its own life is completely disapproved and demolished its own favorite philosophy. When we read what philosophers and poets have said of the last century as they talked about the golden era that was to come it was based on the theory of evalution, not only in the biological sense, and the controlling idea was that the whole of life was advancing, developing, and going upward. We were told in a pretty biological sense, man had risen out of the animal and had arrived at a certain stage of development. Wars were going to be abblished, diseases were going to be cured, suffering was going to be no more and finally eradicated. It was to be an amazing century. Most of the problems were going to be solved for man had at last rally begun to t mink. The masses through education would cease to give themselves to drink, immoraltiy and vice and they would hold conferences instead of rushing on into war. The wholde world was going to be aparadise. By acts of parliment all of these things were going to be brought to pass. Stady old a la kala ev maber o delet of emis ex med

Many people living in the world today believe the same thing. You still find a eliminant of such teaching and such places today.

But the Bible teaches and what Jesus implied in this text. What does it imply? It clearly implies, rottenness,

in the earth, it implies a tendency to polution, to become foul and offensive, that is what the Bible has to say about this world. It is fallen sinful and bad. It has a tendency to evil and wards. It is like meat which has a tendency towoard polution. And so as a result of sin the fall. Life in the world in general tends to drift toward a state of corruption. This is the only right sane xx view to take of humanity. Instead of going upward, it goes exactly in the opposite direction. It tends to festor. There are these germs of evil that infect and unless checked they will cause disease. The Christian should hot be surprised at what is taking place because this is a scriptural position. The Bible is endless in illustrations and we think about the first book in the Bible. The world was perfect because sin entered the evil polution elements at once began to show xxx itself. We read about the sixth chapter of Genesis and we find that God said, My spirit shall always strive with man. Evil in the world was terrible and God sent a flood. When we come to think of Sodom we think of a sin where sin was almost unthinkable and the story in the Bible tells us that God blotted it out. What lied ahead of us? Clearly if we do not start by holding this biblical doctrine at the center of our thinking our prophecy must of necessity be false. The world is bad, sinful and evil. Human society

without God is corrupt and downdagging. No nation in the world is safe without God. No family in the world without God is safe. No man in the world is safe without God. Humna society is corrupt and corrupting without God. That is what the figure of salt so strikingly sets forth and implies. They are to conserve that the wrld is corrupt and corrupting is attested to in every direction that you look today. As you look and see how the world takes a race for gold, take the greed for poverty, the awful clashing everywhere of great races of men, we see the race for amusement and for entertainment and people must be amused, they must be entertained and we see that look for things more sensational than ever before.

What does this say about the Christian in the world?

He says
The kind of world in which you have been looking xxxxxxx, you are to be salt. What does this tell us? The first thing that it tells us is that we are to be unlike the world and we need to underscore think that. There is no need to be stress that it is perfectly obvious. Salt is essentially different from the world. It exercises all of its qualities by being different. The very characteristic of faltiness proclaims the difference, even a pinch of salt, a small amount of salt is out of proportion at once to anything in this world. The Ch istian is a man who is essentially different from everyboyd else. He is different as the salt is from

-

ot make these pronouncements. The main task of the church is to evangelise and pre ch the gospel. The Christian church todayxxxxxxx spends most of her time in denouncing Communism it seems to me that the main result will be that Communists will not be likely to listen to the preaching of the gospel if the church centinues to denounce and shuts the evangelistic door upon that section. Believing Commusits have a soul, they have a soul that needs to he saved, in exactly the same way that everybody elsexx has a soulx. It is the business of the church and the representatives of the church to evangelise all comditions, all classes, everywhere. The moment that the church begins to entervene in politics and social and economics therefore she hampers and hinders herself in the God appointed task of evangelism. Let the individual play the part of the citizen, belong to any political party that you choose. That is something for the individual to decide. The church is not concerned as a support church about these things. Her business is that to preach the the gospel and whenever the church has stuck to her task we have seen changes. When we think about the great awakening during Richard Baxter's preaching not only were the people of of the church revived but many from the world on the outside were converted the whole life and town was effected. The evil, the sin, the vice, was controlled. This happened not

In the Sea of Galibee it saved their fish. These disciples knew what He was talking about. Then the means by which saving was saving was going to be done. A means by which saving was to be profected as they function as salt. As the climate in Palestine it was indespensable for the preservation of food. A bag of salt was reconded as precious as a man's life. And so it preserved the food. Food spoils without this. And so society becomes corrupt and greed and lustful andindifferent and decays without the salt of the Chrsitain.

Second salt provides savour. Or it prevents food from being insepid. This is undoubtly a further function of salt. Life without Christianity is insepid. Does not the world today prove that? Look at the pleasure making mania. Clearly people are finding life dull a d boring so that thousands of them are rushing out for entertainment to these or that. But the Christian does not need those entertainments because he has a savour in life, his Christian faith. Take Christianity out of life and the world and what an insepid thing life becomes, especially when one gets old or one is on his death bed, it is utterly tasteless. So a pinch of salt provides savour. T

Third, it promotes degestion. It gives zest to food.

The Christian folk ought to add joy to the common day because they are Crhsitians. Food otherwise would be distasteful and

not palatable but a pinch of salt aides at this point.

IV. How is the Christian to do this?

In te first place is the church just to make the pronouncements? There should be a vital distinction between the . church and the individuals Christian. Many Christians have the idea that if the church speaks out on the world of politics or ecomomics or international affairs that that will take the place of his salt. There are vast majorities interpret this text as saying that the church ought to denounce communism. talk about war, international situations and similiar problems in a general way and yet I believe that this is the most serious misunderstanding of this verse of scripture. However they feel that they have truth x xx on their side when they point out that the prophets in the Old Testament talked about the church and nation. Of course, we know that there is no distinction between the church and the state then and the prophets addressed the whole nation. They were speaking about the entire life of the people but when we come to the church in the New Testament days it is not identified with the nation or nations in any way at all. The result was that Paul or the earlier apostles never commented on the government of the Roman Empire to a great extent. There are many great pronouncements by the church. Who of James Hot mande and

individual by the individual life, his character, by just being the man that he is in the various speres that he finds

himself.

First by his personal purity. Salt preserves and conserves all it well if the salt is brought into contact with the meat at the right time. And so it is in Christianity by the right kind of lives on the part and by the right kind of examples on our part, we will become the purifying and the preserving power. It is healing. It is changing. It is correction. It is challenging. It is a stimulating power to make the world better. For exampel, when we think of this we think of a man who might walk into the company of people and his very presence will effect the entire conversation and modify the language and the actions of the group. He will cause wix them to sease corruption and because he is a Christian man and because of his life, because of his character, because of his general department, he is already controlling evil. This ought to happen in your home, in your shop, wherever you live, that when you come in, you should be salt. Why of course, you should be salt to the political life. You should be salt everywhere. You should register and vote in the affairs of society. Christian individuals ought to be ggod citizens in the contry.

But you say I thought you said that church and was not

what we are is vital inside. One man of incorruptable per character stands like a great mountain calling the world to the heights above. We should not take any short roads or short cuts. We must live with yourself and you must answer to God. We must be salt which touching the world with saltiness we can counteract corruption and bring healing and health.

Salt must be applied. Salt must contact the meat. Balt is not to be kept in its place and meat in another place but they are to be brought together. That means that God's poeple are to go out into the world and inho the places of society. You must not go into a cave and shut yourself up and say, I will do my best not to be contaminated. Whatever men marks suffer in sin and die you are to go. You are to go with the contact and the Christian appeal and the Christian mesage and save decaying and dying humanity. Salt must make contact to be affective. A man is not to be a Christian only on Sunday morning as he looks into the face of the preacher and sings out of a hymn book or as he greets heartily men around the front door of the church. He must be a Christian on Monday as another seeks to take advantage of him. He must say to himself, I am the friend, the Son of God and I cannot take such a course that misrepresents Jesus,

because the church denounced them but because the church preached the gospel and individual lives were changed and thus they became salt in the community.

In the Old Testament every form add revival brought general benefit to the society. Constant reformation found its affected the whole life, not because of parliment or laws that were passed but because those that were touched became salt. Then the perfect proof of this principles is that in the last 50 years the church paid more attention to politics and the social economic situation than in the whole of the previous 100 year.s We have talked about social application I . . dlab deigned mas dew gade .lite : of Christianity. Pronouncements we have made resolutions and church assemblies. We have all been in tremendous interest in the practical application, but what is the result? No one can dispute it. We are living in a society inwhich there is more immortality than 50 years ago, in which there is more vice, and lawbreaking, more lawlessness than ever before. We are to go into every reals. What would the world be without Christianity. Imagine South Norfolk this 25,000 without a church, without a preacher, without a Sunday school, without a prayer meeting, without Sunday, without an open Bible, without a Christian voice, what would this city be like? What fearful deeds of destruction the adversaries of Satan would work if the conditions I have just named existed?

Ponder the warning. Now what a fearful possiblity is suggested in our text. The Christian either redeems the world ar the world robs him of his Christianity.

Moody once wrote in a man's Bible this book will keep you from your sins or yours sins will keep you from the book. The warning is solemn. We either lose the gift and grace which has been given or either we propagate. We can be a sensational witness for Jesus Christ in an inconspicuous day by day witnessing in a silent manner and yet what if the salt becomes stale if it loses it taste, it is worthless. You can become like that. We may easily lose our

savour. Salt left in contact with a damp sail ceases to be salty. It is neither fit for the ground nor to be used except trodden under feet. Lot is an example of this. Sodom went on its way regardless of his presence in its midst. And he lost his saltiness, there. The seven churches in Asia lost their saltiness and they were trodden down. You can lose your spiritual potency. You can decline in spiritual power. You can become stale and insepid and unprofitable as my friend and my servant even after I have saved you, Jesus says. There are illustrations that are endless in the Bible and out of it. Paul had the very idea in mind when he said, Oftimes there comes over me great terrible fear lest I have preached to others I myself shall become a castaway. He did not mean that he would fail finally to get into heaven. But he meant that he had lost his vitality and his enthusiasm and his vision and his passion and had become cold blooded and a castaway in the kingdom of God, a man discarded and left by the way because my attitude and my spirit is have brought this about. This loss of savour is not only an alarming possiblity it is also a destressing reality all too often.
