To really appreciate the apartment one should have seen it before the renovation began. Mrs. Preston Grissom and Mrs. Wade Ewell spont many hours planning, supervising, buying, delivering, cleaning, and arranging the facilities. Others have given of their time also.

Centerville has spent approximately \$2000 for painting, carpentry work, finishing the floors, furniture, plumbing, carpet for the stairs, and complete re-wiring. More is to be done. New gutters, hand rails for the porch steps, and storm windows are to be installed. The exterior will be completely painted.

We are deeply indebted to other churches, missionary societies, and individuals who have contributed furniture, appliances, carpets, linens, and money to almost thoroughly equip the apartment. We are still looking for another window fan to install in the attic and a window air-conditioner would be useful. We are extremely proud of the antique-handmade bedroom suite which we were able to purchase at a good price.
