Dick was an accomplished pianist, organist and singer who had a long and productive career as a music teacher, director of show choirs and choral groups in many venues. He served as head of the Music Department at Tidewater Community College and taught for a time at Old Dominion University as director of the show choir.

Dick served many area churches as Minister of Music including 20 years at Monumental United Methodist Church in Portsmouth, where as a 21 year-old musician he succeeded his admired mentor, Professor A. J. Lancaster.

Dick worked as accompanist and show choir director for the Fred Waring organization. He taught show choir seminars with Norman Luboff. He was hired for several seasons as director of musicals produced by the Cavalier Dinner Theater in Norfolk. Dick's great passion was the encouragement of singers, and most recently he was devoted to the several musical groups he directed, one of which was the Dick Barnes Chorale. He strongly believed that his talent was God's unexplainable gift, and with any opportunity he generously shared it with many, many people.

Dick is survived by his daughter, Julie Barnes Dunn; two grandchildren, Ian Dunn and Sydney Dunn; his former wife, Mary Barnes; his "Sister", Hunter Jones; and other relatives and friends.
