Dedication of Organ: June 28, 1926. Dr. Hubert Poteat of Wake Forest
College, North Carolina, was present to play the \$6,000 organ at it's dedication. 15 Stops, 2 Manuals. Congregation met in local theater while installation was completed.


Console was moved to position of Baldwin grand piano, which was shifted to left side, on same level. Choir loft was enlarged.

Console with new lighted music rack added in renovation. Deagan chime keyboard below Great manual.






