

But the real headline was contained in special counsel Robert Hur's reasoning.



We could also demand age limits. You can't run for president of the United States until you're 35 years old. Why not cap the age as well?


Age limits would have saved us not just from the catastrophe that is Biden but from Donald Trump, who has displayed his own cognition issues of late.

Worse, he said he'd spoken to 'President Sisi' – the leader of Egypt – about opening humanitarian aid to Gaza, but referred to him as 'the president of Mexico'.

Joe Biden is a walking, talking crisis.

He tried to deflect the report's devastating finding that <u>he couldn't recall</u> <u>when Beau died</u>.

'How in the hell dare he raise that?' Biden growled.

In all fairness to Hur, Biden talks about Beau's death *all the time*. It has become the fabric of his political narrative. It's fair game.

A female reporter: 'Many American people have been watching, and they have expressed concerns about your age —'

'That is YOUR judgment,' Biden shot back, voice full of fury. 'That is YOUR judgment. That is not the judgment of the press'.

But it is the judgment of the electorate. The latest national poll by NBC News found that a whopping 76 percent of voters are concerned about Biden's mental and physical ability to serve.

Yet here were Biden's cheerleaders on Rachel Maddow's MSNBC show, a veritable brain trust offering up all manner of accusations and excuses, shaming the special prosecutor for doing his job — for saying what we all know to be true. What we all just witnessed with our own eyes during that presser.

'What is the word "elderly" doing there?' fellow anchor Lawrence O'Donnell asked. 'Uh... "poor memory" — what is the test of that?'

MSNBC chief legal correspondent Ari Melber: 'Legally there's no interest or relevance [to Biden's cognition],' he said. 'If it's very specifically to the mental criminal intent or *mens rea*... Sure.' Except that the special prosecutor said, in his finding, that Biden's 'poor memory' was *exactly* the reason not to bring charges. To quote the report:

'It would be difficult to convince a jury that they should convict him — by then a former president well into his eighties — of a serious felony that requires a state of willfulness'.

Another heavy lift, courtesy of the network's Chris Hayes: 'There was one adverb that just struck me', he said — referring to the description of Biden as 'painfully' slow.

'I just thought: Who's in pain?... Contained in that adverb is that siren call leaping off the page'.

Well, yes. And rational Americans are heeding it.

Now on to the embarrassment that is Joy Reid: 'It's nasty and snarky, for no reason'.

No reason! I guess national security now falls under the umbrella of minutiae over at MSNBC.
