





The following information illustrates why it is difficult to locate a particular soldier in the official records and, subsequently, difficult to do research:

In the next photo (below) you will see a portrait of Cecil James (Jim) Lucas who enlisted on 4 April 1941 as NX600 Private (Pte) Joseph Charles Lucas (his brother's name), with 23 Battalion. He later transferred to 2/17 Battalion. Pte Lucas served in Greece, Crete, Syria, Bardia and Tobruk and later in New Guinea at Finschhafen and Lae. Pte Lucas was discharged on 14 November 1945. His brother Joseph enlisted in June 1941 under Cecil's name.

Both brothers had put their ages up to enlist. Cecil was one of nine brothers from the Lucas family who enlisted from the Bega district. Many of the brothers had multiple enlistments and some enlisted together and served together for periods of time.



Studio portrait of VX75731 Private (Pte) James Lyon, 2/23rd Infantry Battalion of Richmond, Vic. Pte Lyon worked as a hawker and as a fireman prior to enlisting on 16 February 1942. He completed his initial training in Victoria between March and July and on 15 August he was transferred to the 12th Reinforcements, 2/23 Battalion. He embarked for overseas service on 23 August and arrived in Suez in early October. Between April 1942 and November 1942 the 2/23 fought, as part of the 9th Division, at Tobruk, Libya and El Alamein, Egypt. Pte Lyon and his unit arrived at the conclusion of the Allies successful campaign in the Middle East. The 2/23 Battalion left for Australia on 31 January 1943. After training for jungle combat they arrived in Milne Bay, New Guinea on 4 August 1943. On 24 November 1943 Pte Lyon was wounded in action at Finschhafen, New Guinea. He died of his wounds on 27 November 1943, aged 28 years.



Studio portrait of VX46250 Private (Pte), later Corporal, John Patrick Joy, 2/23 Battalion, of Jingellic, Vic. He was a station hand prior to enlisting on 25 June 1940. Pte Joy, VX42229 Pte Allan Clement Kelly, and VX42266 Pte John Leslie Johnson, all originally from Walwa, Vic, were close friends, who all enlisted in June 1940. Following initial training in Australia, they embarked from Port Melbourne on board HMAT Strathmore on 17 November 1940 arriving in Egypt on 17 December. After further training in desert warfare the unit was sent to Tobruk, Libya, arriving on 18 March 1941. All three were killed in action during the counter attack on 17 May 1941. Corporal Joy was 27 years of age.






