A program of nuptial music was rendered by Mrs. Harry Schooler, of Georgetown. Miss Florence Jacqueline LaBruce was junior bridesmaid, and Miss Anne Barclay LaBruce was maid of honor. Both women are sisters of the bride.

The bride entered with her father, by whom she was given in marriage. She wore an ankle-length gown of white faille with matching hat and she carried a satin prayer book topped with white camellias and fusias.

Mr. Dove Walter Green, of Conway, was the bridegroom's best man. Ushers were Mr. Lawrence Pettigrew LaBruce and Mr. Legare Pettigrew LaBruce, uncles of the bride.
