I. Splendid Homiletics - V. 1-3.

Dr. Broader - Prop. & Del. & Sermons Art of preaching. Part of Theology - Treatment and building for Sermons.

Preach - Primary business of the Preacher is preparing and delivering sermons. Has other duties. Some of Which Church Members should do. Mechingo. Conf. Main Business is Brock Dr. Juff Bay, but secondainy Things like 5thing has on procedain eggs.

Main Business Attention - doctrine - homiletical order - grammer.

Paul says the essential qualification for the Preacher that he must "apt to teach" - Stir up the gift that is in thee.

Previous generation called the pulpit - "The sacred stand". as we know literally the Pulpit stand is no more sacred than any other part of the church building. Thought of it as sacred in the act of preaching the word.

Laymen in addressing the church would not speak from the Pulpit but stood down

Example of Jesus - Luke 24:27 "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the Scripture the things concerning himself".

Distinguished Chief Justice of a southern state said to Dr. James I. Vance, "I would give \$20,000 to have my portrait where yours hangs in the Seminary".

Then he said, "Yours is the greatest calling in the world. The regret of my life is that I did not become a preacher instead of a lawyer".

John could understand this, he had spent his life in the wilderness preaching - he knows the worth of preaching.

Spirit - of Lord comes upon a man called to preach.

Isaiah claimed his commission to preach was from Heaven. The seraphims touch his lips with a live coal from off the altar, and the voice of the Lord said whom shall I send and who will go for us? 6:8.

Ezekiel - "And he said unto me, Son of man, stand upon thy feet, and I will speak unto thee. And the spirit entered into me when he spake unto me, and set me upon my feet, that I heard him that spake unto me. And he said unto me, Son of man, I send thee to the children of Israel, to a rebellious nation that hath rebelled against me, they and their fathers have transgressed against me, even unto this very day". Ezek. 2:1-3.

Call for peculiar service - don't miss this young man if the Spirit gives you an absorbing desire to preach.

Spurgeon says if any man can be content as grocer, farmer, doctor, lawyer, senator in heavens name and earths let him go his way, he is not the man in whom dwells the Spirit of God in its fullness. Must feel woe is me if I preach not the Gospel.

Don't be childish to think of riches in the ministry or a life of ease.

Great Preacher once said "A truly valuable minister would have excelled in anything. There is scarcely anything impossible to a man who can keep a

Set apart - dedicated - with the blessings of God to serve - to work - there are folks who think Preachers work one day each week. A Jewish tailor who was proud of his assortment of styles urged the wife of a preacher to get her husband to visit his shop and look over his goods. She said she would tell him, but she feared he might be too busy to come. "Busy?" he said, lifting his hands and his eyeborws. "I thought he was occupied only two hours in the week." That is a popular conception of what a Preacher has to do.

God's spirit has moved upon the Preacher and anointed - appointed - ordained to a sacred work to Preach.

Cospel) - someone must proclaim it - <u>Jesus</u> was a Preacher. Time of his baptism "This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased - Matthew. 3:17.

Anointed - as Messiah - Prophet - Priest - King. All 3 of these were anointed with oil. Sylvesty Home speaks of The Tromonce of Procher, & Speaks of The Royal Pulpit.

Luke 4:16-21 A man about 30 years - standing up amid a Jewish congregation - ordinary carpenter - one of the village - respected.

Handed him the roll to read from - He unrolls the book until his eyes are fixed on this text. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me" - read a few words - resumes his seat - "This day is this Scripture fulfilled in your ears". He assumes the place of being himself the very one in Prophecy.

The voice of God - commissioned not to be a social agitator or enter politics - but message of God.

The Preacher does not fail who has a message - this is all the early church had.

Splendid Homiletics - The Sermon is outlined with specific points - He is to Preach.

Good tidings to the meek.

Opposite of self-seeking.

Nah. 1:15 - Matt. 5:5 - Poor in Spirit.

Preach good tidings - the gospel to those afflicted by calamity

Poor circumstances - gentle.

Good - (men) need to know that God loves them and that (Christ) can redeem them and change their wretched lives.

The humble - poor. James 2:5.

2. Bind up the brokenhearted.

Heart broken - insist they have done their best but find they are under a curse. Disappointments, losses and sufferings.

Heart broken in pieces - describe as a ship in a storm broken, helpless.

Bind up - healing. Dath, LAZYWS - Mary & Morther

Psa. 51:17 "A broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise".

They that are whole need no physician.

How are hearts so easily broken? Why are many so disheartened?

The world - flesh - devil - defeat - failure - hearts broken by sin.

3. Proclaim liberty to the captives.

This is the group captive in a physical way - Habits - sin - influences that destroy - godless deeds.

Deliver - release.

II Timothy 3:6.

Lev. 25:10 - Jubilee year.

Hebrews 2:15. Deliverance from sin and death.

Cyrus - proclaimed this for the Jews.

Guilty of sin - bound captives - set free.

John 8:36.

Zacheaus - Clutches of Great-Tree-Home_Preparing.

4. Opening of the Prison to them that are bound.

The most complete release.

Jesus does not mention this group in the same way - "Recovering of sight to the blind".

Companion thoughts - Darkness was a dreadful horror of the prison.

Bound - one to whom light was denied.

Spiritual blindness - moral blindness - are greater affliction than physical blindness.

Awful not to see the beauty of the earth - and of heaven.

Jesus came to change that - brought liberty - light to soul of men.

Miracles - removed unbelief - Spiritual ignorance. Not only healing - freedom - a new vision of Spiritual things. Spiritual darkness is bondage.

5. Proclaim acceptable year of our Lord.

Grace for all - 2 Cor. 6:2.

Jubilee of freedom and restoration of an afflicted world.

Who could fix the acceptable year except our Lord. This is the time of Salvation.

Luke 4:19 - Without finishing the sentence, he closed the book because the day of vengeance had not yet come - year of grace. 2 Thess. 1:7-9.

Acceptable - time to accept repentance.

6. Proclaim Day of Vengeance

Contrast year of acceptance - an end to God's long suffering and patience towards sinners - Ex. 20:5-6.

Day of grace last until Christ returns. Judgment against his enemies.

On sin - Satan and Hell. Powers of darkness. Col. 2:15.

Mark 16:16.

2 Thess. 1:8.

7. Comfort all who mourn.

"Laugh and the world laughs with you; weep and you weep alone".

2 Cor. 6:10 Things of Christ cause us to rejoice.

2 Cor. 7:11 - All who mourn or sorrow after a godly sort. Mourn their transgressions, sins, negligences with a sincere desire to be rid of them and serve God truly in the future.

Christ is only one who can provide comfort.

(V. 3) 8. Establish them like oaks.

Plantings of the Lord - Strong oaks for his glory.

Beauty for ashes - crown of glory for the ashes of repentance. Which were usually sprinkled upon the head.

Holiness be their beauty - sorrow turned to joy. Head-dress worn time of joy.

Oil of Joy - anointing the spirit replace the tears that belong to mourners.

Face will shine - countenance. Joy of saints. Perfumed ointment poured on guest at joyous feast.

Garments of praise. Spirit of heaviness replaced with thanksgiving and praise.

Give glory to God - planted - solid - not broken reed.

Bright colored garments worn to indicate Thanksgiving.
